#1 South Stonebridge Road (From Mission South onto 265/Crossover. L on Wyman Road just past the Cliffs Apartments. Go 1 block, turn L onto Stonebridge Rd. 4th driveway on L. Look for sign.)

951 Missouri Way (From College go N on Lafayette St/AR 45. R at Dogwood Ln. R at E. Missouri Way.)

Larrapin Peace Garden by Leigh Wilkerson and Mendy Knott

15048 Draper Rd, (Take Wedington Drive 6.7 miles west from I-540. L on CR 662 in big curve. Forward on 658/Draper Rd/No Outlet. Half mile on 658. Blue mailbox on R. Turn R into driveway, to end of drive.)

Peace Trees Garden by Cathy Boyd

2008 W. Cleveland St. (One house east of the intersection of Cleveland and Sang. Brown ranch style with white shutters and a carport in front. Park in drive or in the lot to the east.)

Bonus! Visit the World Peace Wetland Prairie (FREE)

1121 S Duncan Ave. A City Owned Park. (Turn S onto S. Hill Avenue from 6th Street, go to 11th St. and turn W to S. Duncan and turn S 100 feet to driveway at right. Signs will be up. Nature walks will be led by OMNI volunteers, Aubrey Shepherd and Lauren Hawkins, highlighting Arkansas native plants and describing the value of natural wetland and its function for stormwater abatement and cleansing in an urban environment.
